Minutes for November Meeting

The Douglas County Branch of AAUW Colorado met for a lunch meeting on November 17, 2021 at Siena Restaurant in Castle Rock. Eighteen members and one guest were present. Marcia Miller opened the meeting at 11:30 am. Diane Norten introduced our guest, State President Joan Brown, from the Aurora branch.

Joan is beginning a 3-year term as Colorado's state president and began her remarks by asking several questions about our group. Members responded with enjoyment of our interest groups, camaraderie among members, scholarships, variety of programs and our history and cultures tours. Joan talked about the Colorado Connects Newsletter, now printed monthly, and encouraged members to use the national webinar. She talked about the Action Network, a national informational sheet now recognized by its blue and orange logo. The new CEO of AAUW is Gloria Blackwell and her theme this year is "Diversity, Equality, Inclusion" known as DEI. The average age of AAUW members in America is 72 years.

Thank You's were presented to members who were very active the past several years and throughout the pandemic.

In keeping with the CEO's theme, Diane Norten, Program Vice-President, presented a program on Diversity in America, in Colorado and in Douglas County. Diane used statistics from results of the 2020 census that prove our demographics are changing and we as Americans have to include and accept the different cultures we now experience by becoming aware of the differences, learn about other cultures, take responsibility for how we respond to changes and show patience.

Scholarship Chair Jean Kovatavich passed a sheet with information about how much in scholarship funds we have distributed since 2019. Three deserving women have received scholarship funds from our branch,

all studying in the medical field. Scholarship information and applications were sent this year to six local colleges and universities, but Jean was disappointed with the lack of new applicants these past two years. Since our branch fund-raising was still ongoing and the treasury healthy, the branch voted to continue to support one applicant for her 4th year in medical school. Jean did say we might explore alternative community options to support women, and with the opening of a branch of Arapahoe Community College in Castle Rock, we might find local women returning to school to finish a degree.

Treasurer Marsha Johnson followed up by announcing a \$3000 scholarship check will be sent to medical student Kelly Wigglesworth Stanek. We continue to support National's NCCWL fund with a \$600 contribution and our annual \$1000 to the national AAUW fund. Marsha did express a concern that only about 60% of the membership continues to support our fund-raising efforts and suggested that an additional \$50 might be added to our dues for our scholarships. An affirmative vote was taken.

Linda Gaylo was welcomed as our new Membership Chair and there was discussion regarding updating a membership brochure. Pat Proctor offered to create a new Membership Directory as we have not had one for two years. She asked all to review the current directory and send any changes to her promptly.

Upcoming plans for the 2021-22 Douglas County AAUW ameetings is a zoom meeting of the state's Public Policy Day in February, a STEM program for local 8th grade girls to be held at the Arapahoe Community College campus in Castle Rock on Saturday March 5th. Suzanne Kroepsch and Beryl Jacobson are working with ACC Directors to present a fun and informative day. Volunteers will be needed to help get the word out to our local middle schools so we have a good turnout. A regular AAUW meeting will be held on March 16th, place to be determined.

Before closing the meeting, Marsha Johnson announced we have three free membership dues allowed and member names were drawn from a basket. The meeting was closed by Marcia Miller
