- 1. Geselle Mendez- Hernandez is an Immokalee High School senior who is dual enrolled at FSW. She will be attending FGCU in the fall of 2025 to major in health sciences, with the dream of becoming an occupational therapist. Geselle was awarded the Patricia Ann Weinswig Tribute STEM Scholarship generously donated by Carole F. Barrett, Esq. in memory of her son-in-law's mother. With financial aid assistance, Pat attended the University of Illinois College of Pharmacy, and after graduating worked as a pharmacist in community pharmacies in Indiana and Wisconsin and as a teaching assistant at Butler University and the University of Wisconsin, School of Pharmacy. Pat gave back to her community as a volunteer for Hadassah and B'nai Brith Women and served on the Board of Trustees and as President of Temple Beth El in Madison Wisconsin.
